A brief sketch of Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya:

Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya has been established with a vision of imparting quality production of human being for the society, who will be equipped with holistic education with the synergy of knowledge, skills and positive attitude. Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya (MSSV) has formally been founded on 10th June, 2014, under the Act of Assam Legislative Assembly (Assam Act No.XIX of 2013) by which the University received the assent of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam vide No. LGL 59/2013/16. In its first academic session, four programmes, viz., M.A. in Assamese, Education, Sociology and Computer Application have been introduced. Though, this University has been set up under the Private University Act, it is a peoples' University, particularly of Assam and of India as a whole and its innate throb is the greater philosophy of the saint Srimanta Sankaradeva. The University has been sponsored by the Srimanta Sankaradeva Education and Socio-Economic Development Trust formed by the Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha. This University is located at Nagaon, the place blessed with the dust of Saint's feet for more than half a millennium. The fraternity of this University believes that a new era of social regeneration will start from this Seat of higher learning.

A brief sketch of Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha:

Srimanta Sankaradeva Sangha was set up in 1930 having its aspiration to forward and spread the philosophy and reformatory notion, initiated and conveyed to the people by the saint Srimanta Sankaradeva. An acceptance letter will be sent to the author(s) to his/her e-mail address within two days. The papers will be scrutinized by subject experts, and if the paper is selected, the Coordinator will inform the author(s) on or before 30th October, 2014. No correspondence will be made for rejected papers. Each paper presenter will get 10 minutes for presentation and 10 minutes for discussion. CALL FOR PAPER

Guidelines for the Paper Presenters:

The paper can be written either in Assamese or English. In case of Assamese, UNICODE (Kalpurush) and NON-UNICODE (Geetanjali) font can be used. The paper should be based on IMRAD structure i.e. Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion. In the introduction part, the objectives should be given and an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature review should be provided. The paragraphs should be separated by headings, sub-headings. The section headings are arranged by numbers, bold and 12 pt in Times New Roman for English and 13 pt in Assamese should be followed by the author.

1. Article structure: (Subdivision - numbered sections)

The paper should be divided into numbered sections. Subsections should be numbered as 2.1 (then 2.1.1, 2.1.2, ...), 2.2, etc. Use this numbering also for internal cross-referencing: do not just refer to "the text". Any subsection may be given a brief heading. Each heading should appear on its own separate line.

- 2. Method:** The paper should provide sufficient detail of methods followed by the author. If the author follows already established method(s), it should be indicated by a reference. Only relevant modifications should be described here.
- 3. Results:** The Results section presents the study's findings. Results should be clear and concise.
- 4. Discussion:** Results from the study should be explicitly discussed, explained, and interpreted in the Discussion part. This part should explore the significance of the results of the study, without repetition. A combined Results and Discussion section are often appropriate. Extensive citations and discussion of published literature should be avoided.
- 5. Conclusions:** The conclusion of the study should be presented in a short 'Conclusion' section, which should not simply repeat earlier sections. It is preferred to conclude the paper by the author(s) own view.
- 6. References:** Citation in text- Please ensure that every reference cited in the text must be present in the reference list (and vice versa). Unpublished results and personal communications are not recommended in the reference list, but may be mentioned in the text. Citation of a reference as 'in press' implies that the item has been accepted for publication.
- 7. Reference style:** Latest MLA Hand Book should be followed in Reference Style. The list of references should be arranged in alphabetical order.
- 8. Registration fee:**
 - * Faculty Member with paper : Rs. 700/-
 - * Research Scholar with paper : Rs. 500/-
 - * Participation without paper : Rs. 400/-
 - * Student with paper : Rs. 300/-
 - * Student as participant without paper : Rs. 200/-
 [Registration Fee shall include one Seminar Kit, one lunch and tea]

[Note : Certificates shall be issued to the paper presenters and registered participants who attend the sessions fully.]
